The sun's energy is very strong. It loses a lot of its strength by the time it goes into a plant. When we eat plants, we get more of the sun's energy than when we eat animals. That's why it is good to eat fruits and vegetables. When an animal eats a plant, the energy is less achieved. The animal also uses its energy to find the plant to eat. When a second animal eats the first animal, it gets even less energy than the first animal got. The second animal uses a lot of energy to chase its prey. Like a car that has to be filled with gasoline. Living things have to eat again and again. Instead of gasoline, living things use food as fuel.
