Assessment Strategy

- Assessment will be based on the concept of Independent Assessors empaneled with Maharshi Sandipani Rashtriya Veda Vidya Pratishthan (MSRVVP), identified, selected, trained and certified on Assessment techniques. These Assessors would be aligned to assess as per the laid down criteria.
- MSRVVP would conduct assessment only at the training centers or designated testing centers authorized by MSRVVP.
- Ideally, the assessment will be a continuous process comprising of two distinct steps:
 - o A. Continuous assessment by Trainers
 - B. Term end /Final Assessment by MSRVVP
- Each National Occupational Standard (NOS) in the respective QPs will be assigned weightage. Each
 Performance Criteria in the NOS will be assigned marks for theory and/or practical based on relative
 importance and criticality of function.
- This will facilitate preparation of question bank / paper sets for each of the QPs. Each of these papers sets/question banks created by subject matter experts through MSRVVP, especially with regard to the practical test and the defined tolerances, finish, accuracy etc.
- The following tools are proposed to be used for final assessment:
 - o i. Written Test: This will comprise of
 - (i) True/False Statements and/or
 - (ii)Multiple Choice Questions and/or
 - (iii) Matching Type Questions.
 - ii. Practical Test: This will comprise a test job to be prepared as per project briefing following appropriate working steps, using necessary tools, equipment and instruments. Through observation it will be possible to ascertain a candidate's aptitude, attention to details, quality consciousness etc.
 - iii. Structured Viva-voce: This tool will be used to assess the conceptual understanding and the behavioral aspects as regards the job role and the specific task at hand.

Glossary

| Sector | Sector is a conglomeration of different business operations having similar business and interests. It may also be defined as a distinct subset of the economy whose components share similar characteristics and interests. |

| Sub-sector | Sub-sector is derived from a further breakdown based on the characteristics and interests of its components. |
| Occupation | Occupation is a set of job roles, which perform a similar/ related set of functions in an industry. |
| Job role | Job role defines a unique set of functions that together form a unique employment opportunity in an organization. |
| Occupational Standards (OS) | OS specifies the standards of performance an individual must achieve when carrying out a function in the workplace, together with the Knowledge and Understanding (KU) they need to meet that standard consistently. Occupational Standards are applicable both in the Indian and global contexts. |
| Performance Criteria (PC) | Performance Criteria (PC) are statements that together specify the standard of performance required when carrying out a task. |
| National Occupational Standards (NOS) | NOS are occupational standards which apply uniquely in the Indian context. |
| Qualifications Pack (QP) | QP comprises the set of OS, together with the educational, training and other criteria required to perform a job role. A QP is assigned a unique qualification pack code. |
| Unit Code | Unit code is a unique identifier for an Occupational Standard, which is denoted by an 'N' |
| Unit Title | Unit title gives a clear overall statement about what the incumbent should be able to do. |
| Description | Description gives a short summary of the unit content. This would be helpful to anyone searching on a database to verify that this is the appropriate OS they are looking for. |





| Scope is a set of statements specifying the range of variables that an individual may have to deal with in carrying out the function which have a critical impact on quality of performance required. |

| Knowledge and Understanding (KU) are statements which together specify the technical, generic, professional and organizational specific knowledge that an individual needs in order to perform to the required standard. |
| Organizational context includes the way the organization is structured and how it operates, including the extent of operative knowledge managers have of their relevant areas of responsibility. |
| Technical knowledge is the specific knowledge needed to accomplish specific designated responsibilities. |
| Core skills or Generic Skills (GS) are a group of skills that are the key to learning and working in today's world. These skills are typically needed in any work environment in today's world. These skills are typically needed in any work environment. In the context of the OS, these include communication related skills that are applicable to most job roles. |
| Electives are NOS/set of NOS that are identified by the sector as contributive to specialization in a job role. There may be multiple electives within a QP for each specialized job role. Trainees must select at least one elective for the successful completion of a QP with Electives. |
| Options are NOS/set of NOS that are identified by the sector as additional skills. There may be multiple options within a QP. It is not mandatory to select any of the options to complete a QP with Options. |
